

How to make

**A FRESHWATER PEARL
EARRINGS & NECKLAGE
GIFT SET**

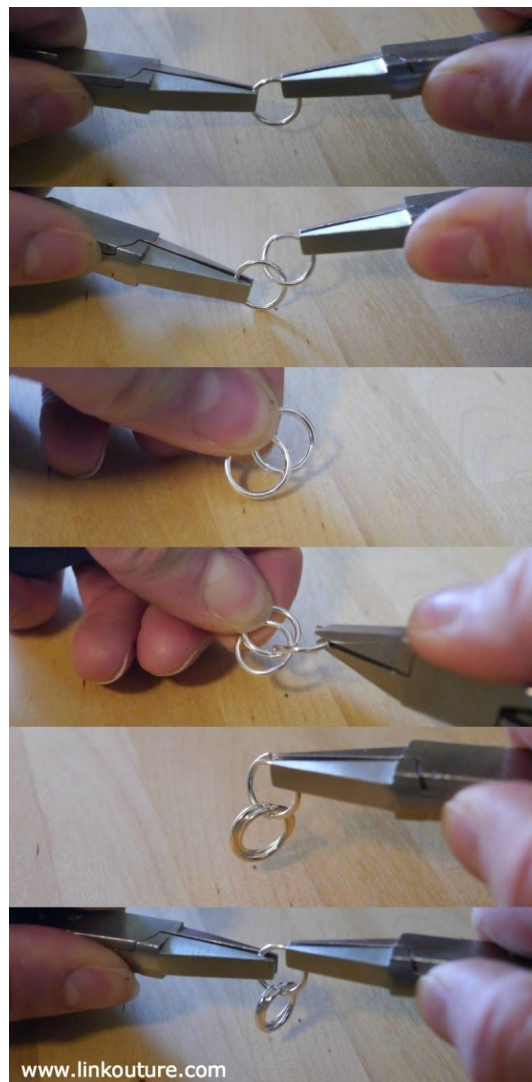


To get started, make five Mobius spirals: two sets with the 18-gauge 7.0 mm ID jump rings, two sets with the 18-gauge 4.0 mm ID jump rings, and one with the largest jump rings (about 9-11mm). If you would like a video tutorial, [sign up for this free course I made](#).

Let's start with the biggest jump rings. Close up one of the jump rings nice and firm. (You know it's closed well when it makes a nice click and the two ends are flush).

Take a second jump ring and loop it through the first one and close it tight.

Take the two looped jump rings and hold them so that there is a space between where they overlap. Think of it as you are making a very small Venn diagram with your jump rings. In that space, loop the third jump ring and close it up. You've made a 3-ring mobius spiral!



Now it's time to make a loop above the pearl beads. String a headpin through each of the pearls. [Check out this video on this blog post](#) for reference.



Trim off the ends so that there is about 1 cm of pin sticking out above the pearl:



Bend the headpin at about a 90-degree angle:

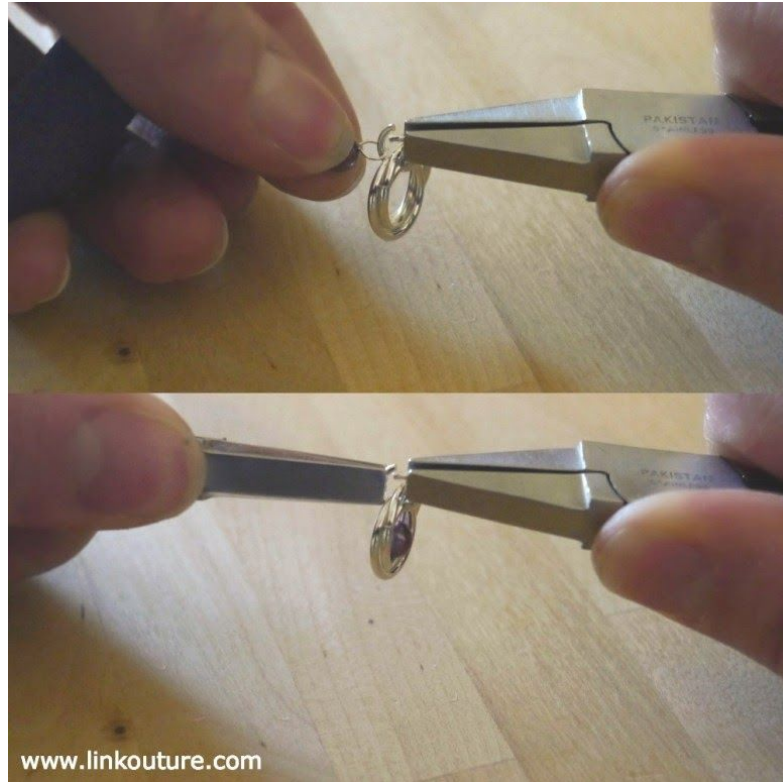


Wrap the hand pin around one nose of the round-nose pliers OR step pliers to form a loop above the bead.



Now to make the necklace!

Take one of the smaller jump rings (3.5 mm) and string it through the largest spiral you made (make sure the three large rings in the spiral stay together). Then string on the pearl through that lovely little loop you just made, and close the jump ring with the pearl and pendant together.



Using the cable chain, loop the really tiny jump ring (2.2 mm) onto one end of the chain and then hook on the lobster clasp so that it's hanging from the chain. Close the ring so it is nice and secure.

String on the pendant, making sure to go through the small jump ring (3.5 mm) so that the large spiral and pearl hang down.



Once it is strung on, string another tiny jump ring (2.2 mm) on the other end of the chain and close it. Loop the small jump ring (3.5 mm) through the tiny one and close. (This is where you will hook on the clasp.) You are done with the necklace!

Now to make the earrings.

Take one of the 3.5 mm jump rings and loop it through the spirals with the 18-gauge 7.0 mm ID jump rings AND through the eye pin loop above the pearl (similar to what you did to make the pendant for the necklace).



Carefully add on the smaller mobius spiral (made from the 18-gauge 4.0 mm jump rings), and gently close up the jump ring holding them together until they make a nice click.



It should look like this:



Add on the ear wire and adjust the earrings if need be so that the pearl is in the front.



Repeat with the other smaller spirals and pearl — the earrings are done!
